Shared Governance

- Shared governance committees provide the opportunity for constituent participation in university governance.
- Academic governance committees are the vehicle by which the faculty influences decisions and courses of action in areas of faculty responsibility by being informed of, expressing views on, and making recommendations about academic issues affecting the institution.

Shared Governance Oversight Committee

 Charged with managing the shared governance process by serving as the entry point and the exit point for all shared governance proposals and also serves as the shared governance liaison to the Chancellor.

Faculty Handbook

- Sets forth the rights <u>and</u> responsibilities of each faculty member
- Addresses the vast majority of issues that may arise involving faculty
- Please read through the Faculty Handbook at <u>Least</u>
 Once
- Consists of three critical components
 - University Mission, Organization, and Governance
 - Personnel Policies
 - Academic Policies and Procedures



Personnel Policies

- Harassment
 - Colleague to Colleague
 - Colleague to Subordinate
 - Faculty to Student
 - Administrator to Faculty



- Academic Policies and Procedures
 - Academic Freedom <u>and</u> Responsibility
 - Student Evaluation of Faculty
 - Student Grievance
 - Pre-tenure Review Process
 - Know and understand <u>Exactly</u> what is expected of you throughout the process.
 - <u>Listen</u> with a view to improve.
 - Be a good colleague along the way.



- Appropriate Use Policy
 - The people of Arkansas own it all, including <u>intellectual</u> <u>property.</u>
 - Do not use the university website or computers for personal profit or gain such as collecting funds via the ASU website.
 - Avoid viewing or sending inappropriate images or comments, including "jokes."
- Arkansas Freedom of Information Act (FOIA)
 - Don't send anything you don't want to have published in The Jonesboro Sun, shown on KAIT8, or relayed to your family.
