<b>Rate Disclosures</b>																																							
The ASU Graduate Status Report for Calendar Year 2015 is a summary of the pre- and post-graduation surveys for graduating classes of May, August, and December 2015. All information is self-reported by the graduates.																																							
<b>Methodology</b>																																							
Two months prior (March, June, and October) to each graduation ceremony, graduating students were provided an electronic test during the "Gradstock" event hosted by the Alumni office for 1 week. The survey was again provided electronically two weeks prior to each graduation ceremony (May, August, and December) to students as they picked up their cap and gowns for their respective graduation programs. Emails were sent to each student approximately two weeks prior to graduation with the link to the survey and emails were sent to each college dean asking for their faculty assistance in encouraging the students in their classes who were graduating to complete the survey. Surveys were completed on a voluntary basis as part of the Senior Exit Survey. All data were imported into an excel file created by the Office of Institutional Research and Planning and the Office of Assessment as the official repositories of data. Student identification numbers are used and verified by the Registrar's Office to prevent duplication of surveys by the same person and to identify those who have not completed the survey.																																							
<b>Column Descriptions</b>																																							
Column information: "Number of Graduates" information was provided by the Registrar's Office from the students' application for graduation. "Responded to Survey" are the number of surveys returned in usable format by the respondents. "Employed Full-time", "Employed Part-Time", "Seeking Employment", Admitted into Graduate School" and "Not Seeking Employment" are categories graduates checked to reflect their status at the time of completion of the survey. Graduates can only check one of the boxes to avoid duplication of information. Salary information on the survey document was presented in ranges. "Salary Ranges Reported by Graduates" reflects the number of responses by respondents for that particular range of salaries for the indicated major.																																							
<b>Post-Graduation</b>																																							
Post-Graduation data for May, August, and December 2015 are included in the data. Students received email requests in early August for the May 2015 graduates, early November for the August 2015, and spring 2016 for December 2015 graduates to complete and return via an online survey.
