
American Degree this year! This degree is awarded to less than one percent of FFA members, making it one of the organization's highest honors. Congrats, Brooke!

# AG POLICY CLASS VISITS SOUTHERN TENANT FARMERS MUSEUM

The STF Union was organized in Tyronza in 1934 in response to the economic hardships of the Great Depression. The Dyess Colony, which was established in Mississippi County by the Federal Government to help dispossessed farmers during the Great Depression, was the boyhood home of Johnny Cash and is part of the ASU Heritage Sites program.
