Program Goals and Objectives

ASTATE Paramedic Program Goal:

The goal of the Paramedic program is to prepare competent entry-level paramedics in the cognitive, psychomotor and affective learning domains.

ASTATE Program Objectives

- Demonstrate the cognitive ability to comprehend, apply and evaluate clinical information relative to the education as an entry-level EMT or Paramedic.
- Demonstrate proficiency in the psychomotor skills required of an entry-level EMT or Paramedic.
- Effectively manage a team of pre-hospital personnel, perform an effective scene assessment and apply acceptable patient care according to protocols.
- Demonstrate proficiency in working as a team and becoming a valuable contributor in decision-making.
- Demonstrate an affective behavior consistent with professional expectations for the entry-level EMT or Paramedic.
- Be familiar with, both, the pre-hospital and clinical environment.

The EMT and paramedic programs are comprehensive courses of study designed to provide the recruit with the cognitive, psychomotor, and affective knowledge and skills that are essential in performing the duties of an EMS professional. The programs offer a broad-based and comprehensive educational experience, rooted in formal classroom instruction, a variety of clinical rotations, and a comprehensive field internship. In each of these phases of the programs, recruits are encouraged and supported by their instructors to take responsibility for their learning and to develop a knowledge base that will make them life-long learners and leaders in the emergency medical services field.
