Scholarly Presentations

Roy Lee Aldridge, Jr., PT, Ed.D and Angela Lewis, PTA, SPT, CYI, gave a platform presentation, "Therapeutic Treatment of Veterans through Yoga," October 20th at the 2016 Annual Conference of the Association of Schools of Allied Health Professions in New Orleans, LA. Crystal Andrew, SPT and Lynda Nash, MSW, Director of the Beck PRIDE Center for America's Wounded Veterans were also authors on the presentation. The research presented demonstrated significant improvements in Veterans' physical function, self-efficacy, and disability through therapeutic yoga as compared to aerobic exercise. Keith's Research Analyzes Licensing Exam Results

Becky Keith, Associate Professor and Director of the Physical Therapist Assistant program, made a presentation at the American Physical Therapy Association Educational Leadership Conference in Phoenix. She discussed findings from her multi-year study on how including assessment of reading comprehension, as a component of students' application process for the physical therapist assistant program, positively impacts pass rates on their licensure examinations.

Hippotherapy Program Featured on A-State's Main Page



One of the unique services available through the Physical Therapy program is hippotherapy. This treatment utilizes work with horses and patients to connect and receive emotional help in addition to physical treatment through equine movement. It is also available to veterans through the Beck PRIDE Center.

The horse provides a base of support that aids in achieving control, balance, building endurance and other movement responses. Students have the opportunity to interact in actual sessions with patients involved in research with trained faculty members. All hippotherapy sessions are held at the Equine Center on campus. The hippotherapy program is under the supervision of Dr. Roy Aldridge, Professor of Physical Therapy.
