I. Call Meeting to Order at 3:30PM by Dr. Amanda Lambertus

II. Reading and Approval of Minutes from February 16th Meeting Dr. Hux moved the motion and Dr. Shaw seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion to approve the minutes carried with no abstensions.

Discussion:

Dr. Hux – Changes in these courses were made to accommodate other programs.

Dr. Shaw motioned in favor of approving the 2 SPED and 2 ELFN courses as written. The motion was seconded by Dr. Henley. All were in favor and the motion to approve these 4 courses as written passed with no abstensions.

Discussion:

Dr. Covey – Programs are moving to an alternative kind of internship.

Dr. Lambertus - Does this affect coursework like Math III?

Dr. Covey – It should not.

Dr. Grymes – It only affects Sr. I and II. None of the Jr. I and II change at this point.

Dr. Fillippino – Does MLED still have a 4-6 grade placement as well as a 7-8 grade placement?

Drs. Covey and Grymes – The state is pushing this and said they do not. We believe this requirement for multiple placements is going away because if they are a paraprofessional for 2 years they would not have multiple placements.

Dr. Lambertus – Will the paperwork would change?

Dr. Hux – The BSE SPED is going through a review and all programs have to a Residency program in place by 2027, so to get that done we have to start now.

Dr. Lambertus - This is the first she heard about this requirement.

Dr. Covey – The state is pushing two different kinds of residencies.

Dr. Hux – We don't have to have it at the secondary level right now.

Dr. Henley – They are testing the residency programs on ELED and MLED

MLED Vote:

Dr. Henley motioned in favor of approving the 1 MLED Residency Program Proposal and 2 MLED Residency courses as written. The motion was seconded by Dr. Hux. All were in favor and the motion to approve these 3 courses as written passed with no abstensions.

ELED Vote:

There was no additional discussion on the ELED program proposal and courses.

Dr. Shaw motioned in favor of approving the 1 MLED Residency Program Proposal and 2 ELED Residency courses as written. The motion was seconded by Dr. Williams. All were in favor and the motion to approve these 3 courses as written passed with no abstensions.

Discussion:

Because there were no representatives from the Music Department in attendance, there was no discussion

Dr. Shaw motioned in favor of approving 1 Vocal Program modification, 1 new Music Education course, 1 new Music course, and the deletion of 2 Music Education courses. The motion was seconded by Dr. Hux. All were in favor and the motion to approve this 1 program modification, 2 new courses, and deletion of 2 current courses as written passed with no abstensions.

Dr. Lambertus moved to New Business, Section b.

b. Gen Ed Math

Dr. Lambertus – I would like to recommend that COPE consider the following change for admission, since STAT 2003 has been added as a general education math option. Audrey, I can help with the Bulletin changes, but it needs to be at the March COPE meeting to get into the bulletin for next year. It isn't an issue for ELED, as they will restrict to the two in place already for the MATH for Teachers' sequence. It is an issue for MLED ELA/SS who could take the STAT as a general education math according to the current bulletin, but then not have met the admission requirements. It could be a concern for anyone's program that points back to general education for the math requirement in the bulletin.

Complete the following courses with a grade of "C" or better in each: ENG 1003, Composition I; ENG 1013, Composition II; MATH 1023, College Algebra (or MATH 1043, Quantitative Reasoning as allowed by degree program); Introduction to Education (specific to each department); and COMS 1203, Oral Communication or Speech Proficiency (as specified by the department)*

DRAFT UPDATED WORDING

Complete the following courses with a grade of "C" or better in each: ENG 1003, Composition I; ENG 1013, Composition II; General education mathematics requirement (refer to program requirements); Introduction to Education (specific to each department); and COMS 1203, Oral Communication or Speech Proficiency (as specified by the department)*

Discussion:

Dr. Shaw - Are we taking out QR and adding Stats?

Dr. Lambertus – No, we are leaving QR but adding Stats. The Teacher ED program says only College Algebra or QR, so anyone taking Stats could not be admitted.

Dr. Grymes – So the new wording is saying programs could determine what math they require.

Dr. Lambertus – I am in favor of allowing programs to choose.

Dr. Hux made a motion to accept updated wording for the Teacher Education admissions policy and the Bulletin. Dr. Williams seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion to approve the updated wording passed with no abstensions.

c. EPP Technology Admission survey

Discussion:

Dr. Fillippino – The Technology Admission survey should be added to the Admission to the Teacher Education program policy Checkpoint I.

Dr. Henley made a motion to accept adding the Technology Admission survey to the Teacher Education program Checkpoint I. Dr. Hux seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion to approve adding the technology survey to Checkpoint I passed with no abstensions.

IV. Old Business – Edits on EPP handbook

Discussion:

Dr. Lambertus – Mission/Vision/Goals need to match in the following handbooks: EPP Governance, Teacher Education, Intern, Quality Assurance, and Teacher Residency.

Dr. Grymes – In the COPE handbook, we should have a policy that states across the EPP, all handbooks should have common foundational information.

Dr. Hux – A common policy will not work for our programs (ELSCE).

Dr. Lambertus – We could start with mission and vision.

It was suggested that the head of the unit could approve a common mission and vision across the following handbooks: EPP Governance, Teacher Education, Intern, Quality Assurance, and Teacher Residency. COPE would like to see this in all handbooks.

Each program will need to figure out where to place the statements within their courses.

The adding wording is needed to correct errors in Degree Works

Dr. Shaw made a motion to accept add wording to the courses in the professional core to fix problems in Degree Works. Dr. Rice seconded the motion. All were in favor and the motion to approve add the necessary wording passed with no abstensions.
