
■ GENERAL INFORMATION

The Doctor of Nursing Practice: Nurse Anesthesia Program is a 36-month, 114-credit hour, full-time program that prepares registered nurses for entry into nurse anesthesia practice. Upon completion of the program, graduates are eligible to take the national certification examination administered by the National Board for Certification and Recertification of Nurse Anesthetists. Satisfactory performance is necessary in order to practice as a certified registered nurse anesthetist.

The Arkansas State University nurse anesthesia program graduated its first class in 2005. Since then, the program has graduated over 550 students. The most recent class graduated in May of 2021. The NBCRNA National Certification Examination (NCE) first-time pass rate was 94%. Prior to that, 100% of the class of 2020 passed the NCE and received offers of employment.



All documentation required by the School of Nursing must be kept current at all times during the course of the program. Students admitted will be required to supply additional documentation, including current ACLS certification, PALS certification, CPR certification, Hepatitis B immunizations, TB skin test, valid unencumbered RN license in the state of practice and proof of professional liability insurance.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Registered Nurse with a Bachelor of Science in nursing from a nationally and regionally accredited college or university.
- Completed application to the Graduate School and Nurse Anesthesia program.
- Undergraduate GPA of 3.0 overall on a 4.0 scale.
- Graduate level descriptive and inferential statistics.
- Current unrestricted/unencumbered license to practice as a registered nurse.
- One to two years of critical care experience as a Registered Nurse in a critical care area with emphasis on interpretation and use of advanced hemodynamic monitoring techniques, psychomotor skills and independent decision making.
- CCRN
- Current BCLS, ACLS and PALS certification American Heart Association (AHA)
