Dubbed the "Las Vegas of the South" by Rufus Thomas, West Memphis, Arkansas, was home to a number of nightclubs where Howlin' Wolf, B.B. King, Ike Turner, Little Junior Parker, Albert King, Elmore James, Bobby Blue Bland, among many other greats, performed for audiences who filled the dance halls and blues joints along Broadway street. During the day, these performers would play on West Memphis station KWEM to promote their shows. Based on their radio performances, many of these artists signed record deals that ultimately led to some of the greatest recordings in music history. At a time when school integration in Little Rock, Arkansas, would soon make international headlines, radio station KOKY went on the air. Known as the "Greater Little Rock Ebony Station," KOKY was Arkansas' first radio station featuring programs targeted toward African-Americans. Combining religious, blues, and rock n' roll programming, KOKY was a significant

radio voice in the history of Arkansas radio. Al Bell would eventually apply the skills he learned as a deejay at KOKY to lead Stax Records to new heights in the soul music industry.
