Graduation Rates for Full-Time, First-Time Freshmen Athletes (2008-2009 Cohort) - Based on the NCAA Graduation Rates Report, the 6-year graduation rate for 2008 full-time, first-time freshmen receiving athletic aid at ASU was 59.4%. Historically, ASU full-time, first-time freshmen receiving athletic aid have had graduation rates as follows:

Historically, ASU undergraduate transfer athletes receiving athletic aid have had graduation rates as follows:

Unlike the graduation rate for student athletes, this figure includes all freshmen--students receiving scholarships and non-scholarship students. Historically, ASU full-time, first-time freshmen have had graduation rates as follows:
