CALL TO ORDER

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

The Faculty Handbook has been delivered to Academic Affairs for clerical review. The question was raised as to if the Handbook would come back to the faculty for review before it goes to the board for vote. It had been agreed that it was to come back faculty before the board vote. It was also requested that the Faculty Handbook revisions be distributed to senators as soon as possible. Senator Maynard will forward the revisions to the AAUP legal counsel for review and comment.
