Here are a few of the unique ways that ASU's College of Education can provide you with a deep, one-of-a-kind learning experience.

#### research

Several of our departments -- including Psychology and Teacher Education -- offer a wide variety of research opportunities. Faculty members in these departments frequently partner with students to design and conduct research, which they later present at state and national conferences.

#### teaching

If you are more interested in learning about pedagogy and teaching strategies than in doing research, we offer you many real-world classroom opportunities, beginning as early as your sophomore year. Our College has long-standing relationships with several local school districts who will welcome you onto their campuses and into their classrooms. Those field experiences will continue all the way through the culmination of your program -- your final semester of student teaching.

The College of Education offers more than 30 unique academic programs at both the undergraduate and graduate level. These programs are designed to prepare you to teach in the P-12 setting, serve as a K-12 administrator, school counselor, school psychologist, or in a variety of other school personnel positions. If you choose to pursue a graduate degree in education, you can continue your studies at ASU, choosing from many different disciplines.

#### outreach programs

In addition to our curriculum, we have extensive outreach programs through our Childhood Services, Educational Renewal Zone (ERZ), and Math and Science initiatives. These programs benefit the entire state of Arkansas, and offer you hands-on experience.

#### accreditation

One way to measure excellence is through external accreditation. All of our professional education programs are accredited with the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE). In addition, our school counseling program is accredited by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP) and our rehabilitation counseling program is accredited by the Council on Rehabilitative Counseling (CORE). Our athletic training program has national accreditation with the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education (CAATE).
