focus on the delta

Unique to ASU's College of Humanities & Social Sciences is the emphasis on the study of the Mississippi River Delta region. Our main campus sits where the Delta meets the Ozarks, and that geographical location lends itself to academic study. Arkansas itself is the focus of several courses taught from the perspectives of history, political science, and geography. In addition, the college offers courses on the Civil War, Southern Literature, African American history, Minority Literature, and Folk Arts and Folklore. We encourage you to use multiple perspectives to explore and understand the interrelationships of history, culture, language and geography both in the Mississippi River Delta, and in other regions of the United States and the world.

global view

Our college moves easily from a regional perspective to a global view. We offer courses in five world languages: Chinese, Arabic, Spanish, French, and German. The Departments of History and Political Science reflect this global reach with courses on Africa, Asia, Latin America, and the Middle East as well as Europe and the United States. The Department of English and Philosophy offers courses in World Literature in translation and World Religions.

study abroad

Many students take advantage of opportunities to study abroad. This year 15 students spent the month of June in Central America with our Costa Rica program. Ten other ASU students spent 10 days in China as participants in a program co-sponsored by the Colleges of Business and Humanities. Thanks to a special endowment, ASU students can also apply for a grant to travel to countries in the Middle East.
