## What's in a Name

### **Arkansas State University**

On first reference, we use our legal name

- Not "-Jonesboro"
- Not "-Main Campus"

### **A-State**

On second reference, we distinguish ourselves

- In prose, always cap A & S with the hyphen
- It "speaks" our logo
- Aligns with our website address: AState.edu
- Online where hyphens not allowed: AState
- Please no ASU, ASUJ, etc.

### **Arkansas State University System**

We are a member of the ASU System

- It's is not the "A-State System"
- Many of these members are ASU-x



## Logos and Trademarks

### **Key trademarks of the university**

- Arkansas State University, and its variations
- Red Wolves, and its variations
- Significant spirit phrases (Howl Yes, etc.)

### One primary logo

- The official university logo includes:
  - The "STATF" mark
  - The university name
  - College, department or division names
- External or entertainment exceptions
  - In coordination with sub-feeds in units
- All uses of the logo or trademark require pre-approval
  - Materials must go through licensed vendors

### One secondary spirit logo

- Reserved for varsity sports teams
- By approval for student or spirit applications
- Generally not used to represent university units



Ark. Code Ann. § 7-1-102 and 103; Governor's Policy Directive #9
"An employer shall schedule the work hours of employees on election
days so that each employee will have an opportunity to exercise the
right to vote."


We want to remind you the same laws also prohibit partisan political activity during state agency work hours or on state agency property.

#### **Employee Leave Time**

Employees will need to work with supervisors to determine if the employee schedule will be flexed for the day to allow time to vote (i.e. come in early or leave late) or if the lunch hour will be utilized or if annual/compensatory time will be
