



A-State Scholar Guidelines (2023-24)

The A-State Scholar is administered through the A-State Financial Aid & Scholarships Office. Any questions concerning the scholarship should be directed to the Financial Aid & Scholarships Office at (870) 972-2310. Arkansas State University reserves the right to make changes to the scholarship program at any time based on available funding and eligible applicants.

What the Scholarship Covers:

* The A-State Scholar award provides up to \$14,000 annually (split between fall and spring semesters), this includes up to \$3000 for on campus housing and up to \$3000 for on campus meal plan, with remaining award for tuition and fees.

* Students who decline to live in an A-State residence hall will not receive the financial equivalent for off-campus living.

* The scholarship pays for courses taken at the A-State campus only. Awards are contingent upon the availability of funding and housing scholarships are contingent upon the availability of on-campus housing.

* This scholarship is awarded for the duration of eight consecutive semesters or through completion of the undergraduate degree, whichever occurs first, provided the student maintains all scholarship requirements.

How to Qualify:

* The scholarship is awarded during the senior year to U.S. citizens who are 2023 high school graduates.

* Students must be admitted to the University. This includes submitting an admissions application with fee, official ACT or SAT scores and official six -semester transcript.

* Students must have a minimum 31 ACT Superscore or New SAT Total of 1400 and a high school minimum GPA of 3.500 on a six-semester transcript.

* Scholarship deadline is February 1, 2023. All awards are based upon state-supported available funds.

* To be considered, students must be admitted to the University by February 1, 2023 and complete the A-State Scholar application at AState.edu/AstateScholar. Students must also submit a student resume, essay, and two reference letters. Your resume should include a listing of co-curricular high school activities, awards and recognition.

* A limited number of awards are available and **scholarships are awarded competitively**.

Student Responsibilities for Accepting and Maintaining the A-State Scholar Award:

Once students have begun their studies at Arkansas State University, the scholarship will be administered through the Honors College. Any questions concerning maintenance of the scholarship should be directed to the Honors College, at (870) 972-2308.

* Students who are selected to receive the A-State Scholar will have until May 1, 2023 to accept their award; however it is recommended that they accept the offer within 30 days. The scholarship offer will no longer be valid after May 1, 2023. Should you accept the scholarship and later decide to attend another university, please notify the Financial Aid & Scholarships Office in writing or by email Scholarships@astate.edu .

To accept the 23-24 scholarship offer:

1. Login to <http://my.astate.edu> Click the *First Time Users* button and follow the prompts, if applicable
2. Select the Banner Self Service button
3. Select the **Financial Aid link** and choose **Award Year 2023-24**
4. Follow the links in the **Scholarships Section** to complete the following:

***Accept/Decline your A-State Scholarship Offer**

***Accept the Terms and Conditions of your A-State Scholarship Offer (If accepting scholarship)**

*** NOTE: Students receiving a room as part of their scholarship package must apply separately for housing through the Office of Residence Life and pay the applicable housing prepayment.**

* Enrollment of a minimum 15 credit hours toward a Bachelor's Degree at the A-State campus is required during each consecutive fall and spring semester. Concurrent enrollment on another campus **cannot** be used to meet full-time enrollment status nor be paid for by the scholarship. Enrollment is locked on the 11th class day. Students in an academic program that is lock-stepped and prohibits 15 hours in any given semester will be allowed to receive their scholarship upon approval of Scholarship Office and receipt of letter from academic advisor. Students in their final semester of scholarship eligibility or final semester before graduation will be allowed to take a minimum of 12 hours. Please notify the Scholarship Office if you are graduating early.

* Students must be enrolled in and successfully complete one Honors course per Fall and Spring semesters. Students must fulfill the requirements to graduate "In University Honors," which includes an Honors Senior Thesis, or the scholarship will be revoked.

* Students must be seeking a Bachelor's Degree.

* All online degree programs are ineligible for Institutional Scholarships.

* Matriculation at the A-State campus must occur in the Fall semester immediately following high school graduation.

* Any student who is enrolled full-time at another college, university or technical college during a regular semester (Fall or Spring) following high school graduation automatically forfeits the scholarship.

* Students who are taking a developmental course as part of their 15 credit hours at the A-State campus and who also plans to test out of the course, must contact the Scholarships Office before taking the test to discuss possible options for keeping the scholarship.

* All college course work is calculated into the overall GPA for scholarship renewal.

* Students who have grade changes are responsible for contacting the Director of the Honors College so that their scholarship status may be reevaluated.

* For military exceptions, contact the Scholarships Office (870) 972-2310.

* Award holders who are dependents of faculty and staff will be paid 25 percent of the tuition and fees scholarship value and 50 percent of the housing scholarship per semester, for A-State credit hours in addition to the faculty/staff discount.

Scholarship Renewal

- Students are required to maintain an overall 3.500 GPA and successfully complete 30 credit hours (fall and spring combined) each academic year at the A-State campus. Note- accepted transfer credits will be calculated into overall GPA.
- Students with incomplete grades will forfeit their scholarship if they do not otherwise meet the scholarship criteria.
- A-State Scholar recipients must be enrolled in and successfully complete one Honors course per Fall and Spring semester.
- Any student who receives all Ws, Fs, WNs, Is and/or FNs at the end of any fall term will lose their scholarship for all subsequent semesters.
- Probation – Any Freshmen, Sophomore, or Junior level recipient who does not meet their renewal criteria at the end of the spring semester will have until the end of that Summer II term to obtain an overall 3.500 GPA and successfully complete 30 A-State hours (Fall, Spring, and both Summer I and Summer II combined) or they will forfeit the scholarship for all subsequent semesters. All classes taken during probation for hour and GPA deficit must be taken at the A-State campus.
- Students that do not maintain an overall 3.500 GPA but have at least a minimum 3.000 GPA and successfully complete 30 credit hours (fall and spring combined) at the A-State campus will be placed on the A-State Chancellor's Scholarship for the duration of their scholarship eligibility.
- Students who have lost their scholarship eligibility have the opportunity to regain eligibility at the Chancellor's level if the student meets the criteria at the end of the following fall or spring semester after losing their scholarship. Students have to have an overall 3.000 GPA and complete 15 A-State hours after fall semester or 30 A-State hours after the spring semester. All course work must be at the A-State campus. Students meeting this requirement simply need to email their scholarship reinstatement request to Scholarships@AState.edu at the end of the semester after regaining eligibility. Students will be notified by email after eligibility has been verified.
