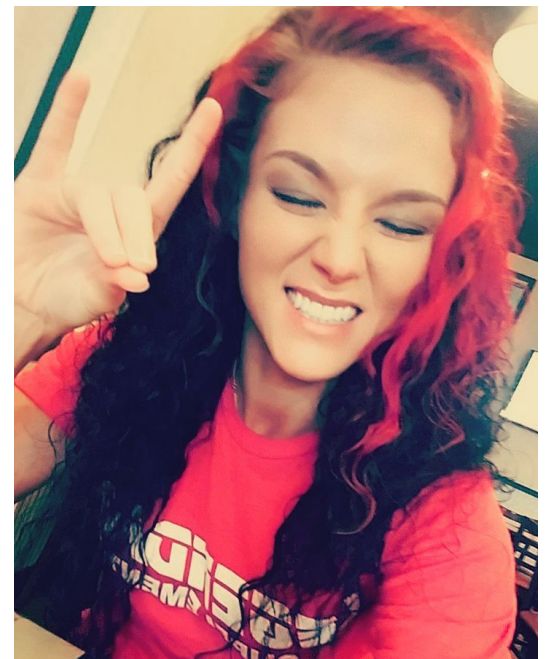
Q & A with Melissa
