## Student Spotlight



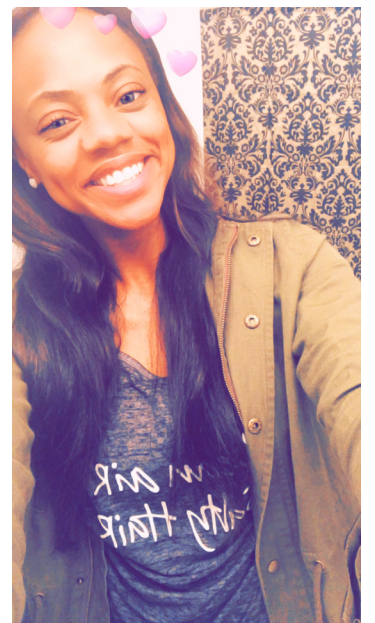
