



2026 OTCAS APPLICATION INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS





As of July 18, 2025, the application process for the Occupational Therapy Doctoral Program at A-State will be through OTCAS.

Overview

Enrollment in the Occupational Therapy Doctorate (OTD) program is limited each year to 30 students. Application scores include the following factors:

- Academic status prerequisite and overall GPAs
- Application essay
- 3 OTCAS requested evaluations.
- Community/Volunteer service (Does not have to be with an Occupational Therapist, healthcare related, or in a healthcare facility.)

To be considered for the OTD program, applicants must apply to **BOTH** the Arkansas State University (AState) graduate school and OTCAS. Admission to the graduate school does not guarantee admission into the OTD program. We prefer applicants to apply to the graduate school before you submit your program application in February. If you do not have a Bachelor's degree, please include your most current transcript through the Fall semester before your application in the Spring semester.

Admission Requirements

In order to be eligible for admission to the Occupational Therapy Doctorate program, applicants must meet the following minimum requirements:

- Completed a Bachelor's degree or are within 1 semester of completing a Baccalaureate degree from an accredited University or College.
- Complete an application to AState graduate school.
- Complete OTCAS application.
- Submit all transcripts to OTCAS. (Submit a transcript from every college/university you attended after high school even if it was for a single class.)
- Earn a final grade of "B" or higher for all prerequisite courses. Applicants must have a minimum of 20 prerequisite credit hours completed at the time of application on February 1.
- A prerequisite GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- A cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale of all college work attempted.
- 30 hours of documented community service. 20 hours must be in a single location.
- 3 pre-professional recommendations (must use admission packet forms).
- English proficiency requirements, if foreign born (see application p. 6).
- Applicants scoring 70 or higher on the admission application will receive automatic consideration by the admissions committee.
- Scores between 65 and 70 will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis for admission.
- Scores below 65 will not be considered for admission.
- Any incomplete application will not be considered for admission





Prerequisite Courses

If you are applying from another university, the course titles may be different. Courses in column 4 are examples of course titles that will substitute for prerequisite requirements. Contact the OTD program director to make sure your prerequisite courses are acceptable. *If you attend a university/college other than Arkansas State, we advise you to contact Dr. Christine Wright, OTD Program Director, to confirm the acceptance of your prerequisite courses. Contact Dr. Wright at cwright@astate.edu.

**If your Medical Terminology course is less than 3 credits, it may affect your prerequisite GPA. We recommend taking the full 3 credits for Medical Terminology.

Bonus courses: Applicants that have completed courses listed at level 3000 or higher with a grade of A or B can earn up to 5 bonus points. Bonus courses can be in any academic discipline except for athletic courses. Prerequisite courses cannot be used for bonus courses. List your bonus courses on p. 21 of the application.

Application Scoring

The maximum score for any applicant is 100 points. A minimum score of 70 guarantees <u>consideration</u> for admittance to the program. Scores of 65 - 70 may be considered for admittance to the program. A score below 65 will not be considered for admittance to the program.

A. Academic status: The maximum points for academic status is 65. Prerequisite and overall GPA's that fall below 3.0 are not accepted.

- **B. Application essay:** The maximum points for the application essay is 15.
 - 0 =Does not meet criteria
 - 3 =Meets some but not all of the criteria
 - 5 = Meets criteria

C. Community/Volunteer Service: The maximum points for community service are 10.

Community Service – applicant must provide evidence of 30 hours of community service (unpaid) work. Twenty of the thirty hours must be at a single facility. All 30 hours can be completed at one facility. Community service does not need to be at a health care facility or other organization that has Occupational Therapy. The applicant must provide written documentation of their service. Documentation must include:

- 1. Letter, on agency letterhead, from the applicant' supervisor verifying the date, purpose, and number of the community service hours completed.
- 2. A one-page summary that includes:
 - a. A description of the community service hours.
 - b. The role and associated activities attended to by the applicant.
 - c. The mission of the entity served.
 - d. Self-reflection of the volunteer experience.

D. 3 OTCAS requested evaluations: The maximum points for the pre-professional recommendations are 10. The Pre-professional rater must return the evaluation form in a sealed envelope with the rater's signature across seal.

Final Application Score and Ranking





An applicant' total score is calculated by summing A + B + C + D = /100. The admission committee ranks the applicants in numerical order highest to lowest. The top 30 applicants receive a position in the program. Remaining eligible applicants are ranked from 31 onward and placed on a waiting list. If a top 30 applicant declines, the admissions committee offers the position to the next applicant on the waiting list. The waiting list remains open until the first day of the fall semester. All remaining applicants are notified that they are declined a position in the program.

Spanish Proficiency Bonus

Spanish proficiency is not required for application but can enhance the applicant's overall score. Students must prove their proficiency by taking the ACTFL – OPI (Oral Proficiency Interview). Students Applying to the AState OTD Program from non-AState Undergraduate Programs

The AState OTD program does not admit students preferentially with a baccalaureate degree from AState and/or prerequisite coursework from AState.

To be considered for the AState OTD program, an applicant must complete a baccalaureate degree from an accredited school recognized by the U.S. Department of Education and a regional accrediting body. Prerequisite coursework must also be completed from an accredited school recognized by the U.S. Department of Education and a regional accrediting body. If an applicant takes any OTD prerequisites at another school, the OTD program director may request a copy of the course syllabus to assure that the course covers the same content as the Arkansas State University prerequisite courses.

To ensure that prerequisites from other schools will meet the AState OTD program requirements, applicants are encouraged to request course reviews from the OTD program director/Department Chair prior to applying.

Pre-requisite requirements from an accredited university other than AState:

- Anatomy I and II with labs (2000 or higher): Minimum of a 2000 level and a grade of B or higher. If the course is not at the 2000 level or at least 3 credits, the applicant must seek permission from the Department Chair to accept the course.
- Medical Terminology (1000 or higher): 1 3 credit hours and a grade of B or higher in an undergraduate (1000 level or above). If your Medical Terminology course is less than 3 credits, it may affect your prerequisite GPA. We recommend taking the full 3 credits for Medical Terminology even if more than one course needs to be completed.
- **Physics** (2000 level or higher): Minimum of 3 credit hours and a grade of B or higher. Physics lab is not required. If the course is not at the 2000 level or at least 3 credits, the applicant must seek permission from the Department Chair to accept the course.
- Introduction to Psychology (1000 level or higher): Minimum of 3 credit hours with a grade of B or higher. If the course is not at least 3 credits, the





applicant must seek permission from the Department Chair to accept the

- **Abnormal Psychology (2000 level or higher):** Minimum of 3 credit hours with a grade of B or higher. If the course is not at the 2000 level or at least 3 credits, the applicant must seek permission from the Department Chair to accept the course.
- **Developmental Psychology** (2000 level or higher): Minimum of 3 credit hours with a grade of B or higher. If the course is not at the 2000 level or at least 3 credits, the applicant must seek permission from the Department Chair to accept the course.
- **Applied Statistics (2000 level or higher):** Minimum of 3 credit hours and a grade of B or higher. If the course is not at the 2000 level or at least 3 credits, the applicant must seek permission from the Department Chair to accept course.

English Proficiency Requirements

The Department of Occupational Therapy requires a high level of proficiency in English so that all students will be able to fully meet academic and clinical objectives as well as meet criteria for professional licensure. All *foreign-born students must take one of the following tests:

- 1. Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) with a score of 83 on the preferred internet-based test (iBT), 570 on the paper-based test, or 213 on the computer-based test.
- 2. International English Language Testing System (IELTS) with a score of at least 6.5 and a spoken band score of 7.
- 3. Pearson Test of English Academic (PTE) with a score of 56.

The TOEFL is available at the A-STATE Testing Center. When taking the exam off campus, the report code for Arkansas State University is 6011.

Advanced Placement

The admissions process for the Occupational Therapy Doctoral Program requires letter grades to determine overall and prerequisite GPA's, therefore, AP exam scores will be calculated in the following manner: Exam scores of 3 or above are three credits at a grade level of B.

Credit for Experiential Learning or Work Experience

Experiential learning and prior work experience are not accepted as substitutes for academic requirements.





Transfer Students

Transfer students will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Students that are currently enrolled in another accredited OTD program may apply to the AState OTD program using the regular admissions process. Should a transfer student be admitted to the AState OTD program, up to nine graduate credit hours may be used to satisfy degree requirements of the OTD. The OT department admissions committee reviews syllabifrom previous OT program and determines which courses meet AState OTD standards. The OT department admissions committee and AState graduate school determine if a student may transfer.

Application Procedure

- 1. Create account and apply to OTCAS at https://otcas.cas.myliaison.com/applicant-ux/#/login.
- 2. Submit completed OTCAS application. All OTCAS applications must be VERIFIED on or before **February 1st.** We recommend submitting your OTCAS application no later than January 5th. Incomplete applications will not be considered. Late applications will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Students will be notified of their acceptance status by **March 31.**
- 3. Apply to the graduate school at Arkansas State University. Application instructions can be found online at http://www.astate.edu/info/admissions/graduate/how-to-apply/.
- 4. Submit all immunization records to the graduate school. **DO NOT** send any records to the Occupational Therapy department.

Background Check

Based on recent legislation in Arkansas, students are required to complete a background check AFTER they receive conditional admission into the program. Arkansas State University's College of Nursing and Health Professions works with Verified Credentials, Inc. to establish an acceptable screening procedure. The cost of the background check is \$100.

The Occupational Therapy Doctorate Program requires all OTD students to carry personal health insurance. Students must provide hard copy proof of health insurance to the department Chair after acceptance into the program. Students must provide proof of health insurance by mail, fax, or hand delivery no later than August 1 every year in the program. Clear copies of both sides of insurance card will suffice as proof.

AState OTD students are required to carry a minimum of \$1,000,000 (one million) of liability insurance the entire time they are in the program. Student liability insurance cost varies but typically does not exceed \$90 per year.













The first 3 sections of the application contain information required by the OTCAS system. Section 4 is for specific information required for Arkansas State OTD application.

Section 1: Personal Information - Consists of basic information to describe who you are. Complete all sections.




Section 2: Academic History - Consists of information about your academic history. We do not require any standardized tests like the GRE so you can select "none" for that section.








Section 3: Supporting Information - Section 3 includes your recommendation evaluations and personal statement. We do not require observation hours, but if you have hours you may list them in this section. You may also list resume items such as work experience in this section.








Section 4: Program Materials - Section 4 is for adding Arkansas State OTD program as your choice or one of your choices to send your application. Click on "Add a Program" in the Program Materials Box. Once you click, you will see this page:




Scroll down to where it says Arkansas State University.








Click on "Occupational Therapy Doctorate.




When you click on "Occupational Therapy Doctorate", our program description box pops up.








To add Arkansas State University OTD program to your application, click on "+" sign next to our program name.




Once you add a program, you will be taken to the payment screen. An application with a single program is \$169.00. Each additional program selection is \$71.00.








Once you select our program, you will go back to the section 4 and select the "Arkansas State OTD" link. Once you click on the link, you will land on our program page.



Click on the "Questions" tab to complete your essay. Click on the "Documents" tab to upload your volunteer reflections and signed documentation of your completed hours. The prerequisites tab will prompt you to go back and check your transcript to make sure you have all the required courses.

Once you have completed the entire application, review your materials for accuracy. When you are happy with your information, click "submit application".
