I. Called to order

b. Teacher Education Bulletin update for COEBS

Department of Teacher Education
i. The requirements for graduation are all over the place. There is a need to list all the requirements for graduation, including when to take praxis. These 5 steps are already in the teacher education handbook.
ii. Dr. Bowser informed the group that as residency pushes forward, students will have to take the Praxis before residency. This includes students with the Aspiring Teacher permit and anyone in the Apprenticeship Program.

Motion to approve the teacher education graduation requirements language ( $1^{\text {st }}$ by Tonya and $2^{\text {nd }}$ by Lisa)—all approved.
iii. Three comments were sent directly to Joanna regarding EDA's current draft version. Please seed the hard copy of the document given out with highlights in yellow, showing the changes made. These changes are to be added to the handbook as well as reflect the cleaning up of the language.
iv. Dr. Grymes indicated the removal of the "0-3 hour class" that does not exist. Ensued to use more student-friendly language. The language must be clear and precise. Counseling the students out of the program was of concern to Joanna. -

1. CAEP asked what is done with problem students. The language must be carefully worded. Dr. Bowser indicated that other universities do have limits on the number of interventions and appeals interns can have. Should we put a limit on remediation like the number of times to appeal was advanced? We need to figure out an answer to this question.
2. Currently, students can appeal-admittance for all programs.
3. Documents are cleaner and the correct persons are involved. The key partners are involved only in the EDA remediation.

The motion to present the recommendation to the EPP was made - Dr. Bowser reminded us that any changes made must be discussed with the EPP, which is not a governing body. Make COPE and EPP aware. It is not a voting document just an awareness document.
