- is integrated with district goals to improve education;
- is guided by a coherent long-term plan;
- is driven by disaggregated data on student outcomes;
- is designed according to teacher-identified needs;
- is school-based;
- is designed around collaborative problem-solving;
- enables teachers to work with colleagues, in their school building;
- is continuous and ongoing, providing follow-up

GOAL/STANDARD 1-A

 Changes to pre-service education are made at the Institution of Higher Education to prepare candidates for implementing Common Core State Standards and College and Career Readiness Skills in the public school classrooms.

The ERZ Can Assist the University with:

Assisting the University in considering new approaches to some pre-service such as Professional Development Schools

- We are now in the preliminary stages and discussing a more intense relationship with some partner schools as professional development schools-PDS.
- Professional development schools (PDS's) are innovative institutions formed through partnerships between teacher education programs and pre-K - 12 schools.
- Their mission, like that of a teaching hospital in the field of medicine, is complex, consisting of strong professional preparation through intensive clinical experience.
- It allows for the development of innovative teaching practices as university faculty and classroom teachers collaborate on new methods and approaches to instruction.
- It provides university faculty with an opportunity to conduct research, and field test and disseminate educational innovations.
- It provides in-service opportunities and practice for the participating school district.






Rigorous Curriculum


2012 Survey of ERZ Principals






What do we do?

Goal 6—There is **collaboration** among the Institution of Higher Education partners, education service centers, partner schools, and communities to accomplish the mission of the Educational Renewal Zones. **Activities** of the Education Renewal Zone address the needs of partners and are designed to strengthen the partnerships. There is sufficient networking among partners to support processes for building leadership capacity and integrating the Common Core State Standards.

What is being done?

- Continue to initiate, <u>expand and nurture the</u> <u>network of relationships</u> that the ERZ has created with various school, university and community partners.
- Involve partner school teams and university and other experts in examining external measures of school improvement such as test scores, graduation rates, attendance and other measures to diagnose school needs and plan/adjust ERZ strategic plans to address these.
- Ensure that <u>university professors, administrators,</u> <u>and staff</u> who work with partner schools <u>are very</u> <u>familiar with the ERZ goals</u> and know how their contributions to schools fit within these goals.
- Sponsor events and/or continue to share in a variety of ways that <u>provide a forum to "cross-pollinate"</u> <u>ideas for addressing ERZ goals</u>, particularly those on topics that might not be addressed as frequently by other agencies such as parent involvement, recruitment and retention, and mentoring programs for both teachers and students.
- Maintain a "core" advisory group and encourage this core to attend all quarterly advisory meetings in order to function as true advisors to the ERZ.


