

Simon J. Bronner Bio

Simon J. Bronner is Distinguished Professor Emeritus of American Studies and Folklore at the Pennsylvania State University, and in 2018-2019 the Maxwell C. Weiner Visiting Distinguished Professor of Humanities at the Missouri University of Science and Technology. He has also taught folklore and cultural history at Harvard University, Dickinson College, University of California-Davis, Leiden University (Netherlands), Beijing Normal University (China), Latvian Academy of Culture, and Osaka University (Japan). He is the author and editor of over forty books on folklore, ethnology, and cultural history, including *Oxford Handbook of American Folklore and Folklife Studies* (2018), *Folklore: The Basics* (2017), and *Explaining Traditions: Folk Behavior in Modern Culture* (2011). In 2015, the American Folklore Society presented him with the Kenneth Goldstein Memorial Award for Lifetime Achievement in Academic Leadership and in 2017, the Lifetime Scholarly Achievement Award for his work on youth culture.
