- Claude asked, is there a plan to lock buildings for access in light of events at Michigan?-Building liaison to lock doors; will take longer to plan to be able to lock centrally; need key card access to all buildings; Union and Library planned (high traffic areas and most students congregate), then roll out to other buildings.
 - LSW/LSE- don't know the timeline yet

Canvas Rollout, Dr. Will McClean:

• Canvas is working, but getting it to pull from Banner is a work in process with the Banner update

- Have moved over 5,000 Blackboard shells/classes. K-16 moving courses. 98% integrity or greater that courses will move correctly and not have to be redone. Next week/week and a half, all courses will be moved over.
- Start up resources are available. Can attend drop-in sessions in CETL. Kaltura Training resource website has recorded sessions. March sessions coming out soon. Zoom and in-person sessions. Online asynchronous course also available. Phone and chat feature available with Canvas; Canvas community is a resource as well.
- Ruth and Dean handling on campus; Chris handling AOS.
- If class starts May 16th, you will be able to use Canvas (including Maymester courses). Can use Blackboard if the course will be completed by July 1.
- Canvas is easier, more intuitive. Rubric creation, tests.

- Ed would like to establish a committee to explore a resolution to change the teaching load- Chairs have been working on a resolution to standardize the chair workload; several have come to Ed about working on teaching load to reflect R2 status and peoples preference (research vs teaching). Need a resolution. Math and Science have shared their teaching load policy. Not a one-size-fits-all.

- Would like to have something by the end of the semester and work over summer, and then have something for the next senate in fall to immediately pick up on.
