

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
FOR THE COLLABORATIVE DELIVERY
OF ACADEMIC PROGRAMS**

This Memorandum of Understanding is entered into this 1st day of July 2023, by and between Arkansas State University (hereinafter referred to as "ASU"), located at 2105 Aggie Road, Jonesboro, Arkansas 72401, and Dyersburg State Community College (hereinafter referred to as "PARTNER"), located at 1510 Lake Road, Dyersburg, Tennessee 38024, for the purpose of establishing a cooperative program through curriculum articulation and credit transfers which will develop a range of programs at and between the PARTNER and ASU.

1. PURPOSE OF MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

ASU and PARTNER have entered into this Memorandum of Understanding for the purpose of fulfilling a shared desire of the two (2) institutions in the areas of internationalization, modernization, and diversification of education, in order to improve the overall quality of education, with the advantages for both parties being complementary. PARTNER and ASU through consultation based on the principles of reciprocity and mutual benefit have reached the following agreement to conduct a joint bachelor's degree program, respectively, in Nursing, Business Administration, Psychology, Criminology, and Sociology (hereinafter referred to as "Cooperative Program").

2. TERM

This Memorandum of Understanding shall be in effect as of the date above set out and shall remain in effect for five (5) years. The Memorandum of Understanding shall be renewed upon the mutual agreement of the parties. The Memorandum of Understanding may be cancelled for cause in the event any obligation of either party is not met within thirty (30) days following the issuance of written notice of a purported breach. The Memorandum of Understanding may be cancelled without cause by giving ninety (90) days' written notice; however, ASU and PARTNER agree to give a good faith effort to helping registered and enrolled students meet their educational obligations upon termination.

3. AGENCY OF THE STATE

A. All parties recognize and agree that ASU is an Agency of the State of Arkansas, and, as such, has sovereign immunity. Nothing in this Memorandum of Understanding is intended to or shall be construed as waiving that sovereign immunity.

B. All parties recognize and agree that PARTNER is an Agency of the State of Tennessee, and, as such, has sovereign immunity. Nothing in this Memorandum of Understanding is intended to or shall be construed as waiving that sovereign immunity.

4. COOPERATIVE PROGRAM MODELS

A. The Cooperative Programs are to be set with a model of 2 + 2 which are carried out by curriculum articulation and credit transfers between PARTNER and ASU. The specialties shall be in Nursing, Business Administration, Psychology, Criminology, and Sociology bachelor's degrees from ASU.

B. The Details of the Models

i. "2 + 2 Bachelor's Degree" the first two (2) years of study shall occur at PARTNER, and the last two (2) calendar years of study shall occur at ASU.

ii. Students who are going to participate in this program shall be undergraduate students registered at PARTNER majoring in Nursing, Business Administration, Psychology, Criminology, or Sociology.

iii. Students will need to enroll and complete pre-approved courses with satisfactory grades to be admitted to the Cooperative Program. Any courses taken outside of the preapproved list may not be counted to qualify for admittance to the Cooperative Program.

5. OBLIGATIONS OF PARTNER

PARTNER shall meet the following obligations:

A. PARTNER will be responsible for promoting the program and enrolling students in the Cooperative Program at PARTNER's campus.

B. PARTNER will be responsible for management of students at PARTNER's campus.

C. PARTNER will be responsible for managing its facilities, including classrooms, computer labs, workshops, language labs, libraries, and physical education places.

D. PARTNER will be responsible for the delivery of preapproved courses for the first two (2) calendar years of the Cooperative Program.

E. PARTNER will be responsible for the management and teaching quality at PARTNER's campus.

F. PARTNER will acknowledge all the courses offered at ASU in the last two (2) calendar years.

6. OBLIGATIONS OF ASU

ASU shall meet the following obligations:

A. ASU will be responsible for the delivery of courses for the last two (2) calendar years of the Cooperative Program.

B. ASU will be responsible for providing teaching plans, samples of textbooks, and reference books to PARTNER faculty in order that PARTNER's faculty may familiarize themselves with the ASU courses.

C. ASU will be responsible for the teaching quality and management of the degree programs at ASU.

D. ASU will be responsible for issuing ASU Bachelor's degrees in Nursing, Business Administration, Psychology, Criminology, and Sociology as applicable, to all students who have completed successfully the entire Cooperative Program and satisfied all the requirements of ASU for the degree.

7. IMPLEMENTATION

A. Each party shall obtain the written consent of the other (in advance and prior to each use) before they may use the name and/or logo of the other party in any materials or communications not related to this Memorandum of Understanding.

B. The parties agree to provide the necessary facilities and support for this Cooperative Program, and staff visits where appropriate. Each party shall undertake their own travel and expenses in relation to visits to another party.

8. APPROVED COURSE REQUIREMENTS

The parties agree that the courses for each particular major, as set forth in Appendix A, shall be the courses which must be taught by the respective party, based upon the year designated for the course's instruction, and that the students enrolled in the Cooperative Program must successfully complete the requirements of each course for the particular major to earn a degree in that program

9. FORCE MAJEURE

Neither party shall be considered in default in the performance of its obligations under this Memorandum of Understanding if such performance is prevented or delayed by Force Majeure. "Force Majeure" shall be understood to be any cause which is beyond the reasonable control of the party affected and which is forthwith, by notice from the party affected, brought to the attention of the other party, including but not limited to war, hostilities, revolution, civil commotion, strike, lockout, epidemic, accident, fire, wind, or flood, or because of any law, order, proclamation, ruling, regulation, or ordinance of any government or subdivision of government, or because of any act of God.

10. ENTIRE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes any contemporaneous or previous written or oral agreements, representations, or undertakings concerning the matters and arrangements provided for in this Memorandum of Understanding. No supplement, modification, or amendment to this Memorandum of Understanding will be binding unless such supplement, modification, or amendment is in writing and signed by all parties.

11. WAIVER

A waiver of any provisions of this Memorandum of Understanding will not be considered a waiver of any other provision whether or not similar, nor will any waiver on one occasion constitute a continuing or permanent waiver.

12. NOTICE

Any request, notice, or other communication to be given under this Memorandum of Understanding must be in writing and delivered personally or by messenger, courier service, or sent by registered, certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, as follows:

All notices will be considered effective upon receipt if delivered personally, by messenger, by courier service, or by registered mail.

13. SUCCESSORS

The terms, warranties, and memorandum of understandings herein contained shall bind and inure to the benefit of the respective parties hereto and their respective legal representatives, successors, and assigns.

14. ADDITIONAL DOCUMENTS

The parties shall execute any additional documents reasonably necessary to effectuate the provisions and purposes of this Memorandum of Understanding, including specifically all documents necessary to set tuition and fees for each term.

15. COUNTERPARTS

This Memorandum of Understanding may be executed in one or more counterparts, including facsimile copies, each of which will be considered to be an original. All counterparts together will constitute the same instrument. The signing of this Memorandum of Understanding at different times and places by the parties will not affect the validity of this Memorandum of Understanding.

16. SEVERABILITY

Any provisions herein declared invalid under any law shall not invalidate any other provisions of this Memorandum of Understanding.

17. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS, STATUTES, TREATIES, RULES AND REGULATIONS

All parties agree to comply with all laws, statutes, treaties, rules, and regulations governing the provisions of this Memorandum of Understanding. As for other matters or issues that may occur during the program implementation, such issues should be discussed through meetings and negotiations with the intention of achieving consensus. If any dispute occurs in the course of the program implementation between ASU and PARTNER, both parties agree to resolve all differences in a friendly manner, whenever possible.

18. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

A. FERPA Compliance and Personal Data Protection: PARTNER is a designated school official with a legitimate educational interest in storing, accessing, transmitting to, and receiving from ASU only the educational records of those Participating Student Applicants under this Memorandum of Understanding, and shall only receive those records ASU deems it necessary for PARTNER to have in ASU's sole discretion.

In accordance with the laws of each country on protection of personal data, the parties agree that the personal data provided by the parties, for cases in which the personal data is regarding a natural person or representatives of a legal entity, will be incorporated into a file and/or database which shall be owned by each of the parties. The purpose of providing the data is for the activities of this Memorandum of Understanding, as well as the maintenance of contact on both sides.

In compliance with current regulations, the parties guarantee that they have adopted the technical and organizational measures necessary to protect the data under the same standards which are used to protect said party's own data, provided that in no case shall that be less than a reasonable standard of protection. In addition, the parties shall not assign or communicate the personal data stored in their files and/or databases to third parties, except when necessary for the performance as outlined under this Memorandum of Understanding, when required by law or the order of a court of competent jurisdiction, or upon the written consent of the other party.

B. Compliance with Anti-Kickback Legislation: Anti-Kickback Enforcement Act of 1986, Public Law 99-634 (41 USCA §§51-58) - By agreeing to this Memorandum of Understanding, the parties (1) certify that they have not paid kickbacks directly or

indirectly to any employee of ASU or PARTNER for the purpose of obtaining this or any other agreement, memorandum of understanding, purchase order, or contract from ASU and; (2) agree to cooperate fully with any Federal Agency investigating a possible violation of the Act. Furthermore, both parties recognize their duties under the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act of 1977 (15 USCA §§78dd-1) which makes it unlawful for certain classes of persons and entities to make payments to foreign government officials to assist in obtaining or retaining business.

C. Compliance with Export Control Laws: Each party shall be responsible for adhering to all applicable international and domestic import/export control laws.

This Memorandum of Understanding will take effect upon the signature of both parties.

The parties hereby sign this Memorandum of Understanding for the Collaborative Delivery of Academic Programs by their duly authorized officers as of the date and year above stated.



