Learning Loss Due to Covid-19



Is Learning Loss a Problem?
At its peak, UNESCO (2020) reported that nearly 1.6 billion learners in more than 190 countries, or 94% of the world's student population, were impacted by educational institution closures.

The gap between students of different socio-economic backgrounds

In schools that predominantly serve students of color, test scores were 59% of the historical average in math and 77% in reading.





The long term effects of learning loss

A study done by Currie and Thomas (2001) found that a 0.20 standard deviation decrease in standardized test scores could decrease future employment probability by 0.86%.

Why should the Astate community care about this issue?

This issue affects the Astate community because both incoming and current students may have been experienced learning loss due to covid-19.





What can people do to help?

A study done by researchers at UC San Diego, with help from the volunteer mentorship nonprofit CovEducation, matched students with volunteer tutors from research universities. They found that the tutoring helped students close about 1/4 - 1/3 of their learning loss due to covid-19.

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
