This course modification request includes the need to drop the words "full-time" from the title of this course and in the description as it is no longer specified as a full-time course. Part-time and full-time students will take the same course with their degree plans reflecting part-time or full-time hours depending on how many other courses they are enrolled in.

This course modification request includes a change in credit hours from 3 to 2. In the traditional face to face program, students completed Foundation Field I and Foundation Field II, both at 3 credit hours each to total of 6 credit hours for the foundation field sequence. In order to adjust to the 7-week semester of the online program, a third course will be added to the foundation field sequence. Students will complete their foundation field internship hours over three courses at 2 credits each.
