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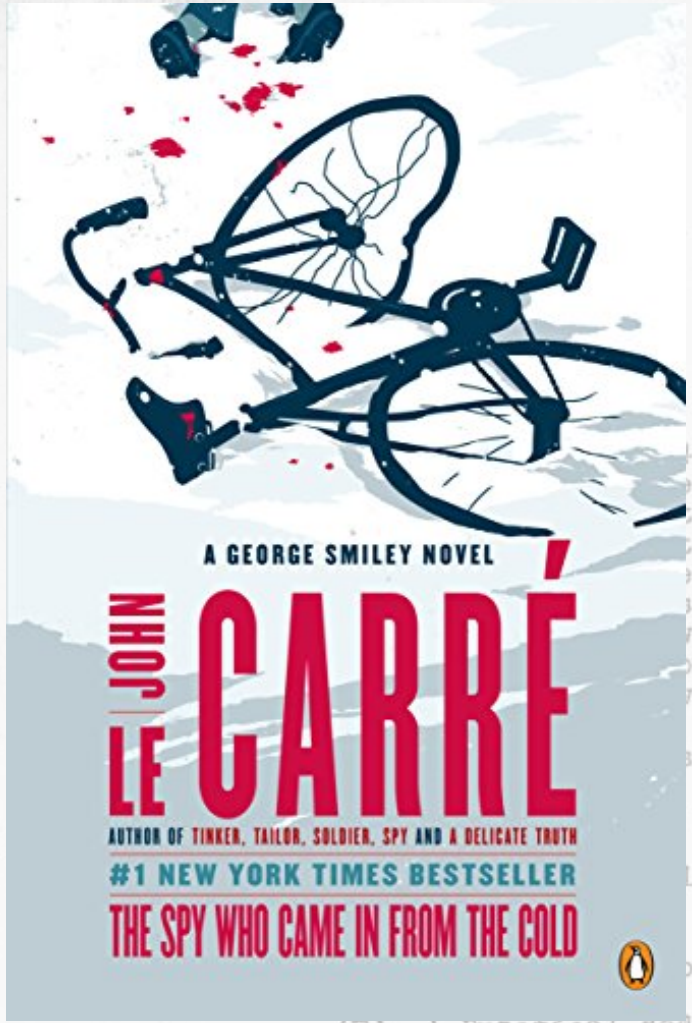

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Major Project

Each student will be assigned a persona for the class. The persona will be a fictional character that could have lived during the Cold War. Using the persona, each student will develop a biography of the person and trace their fictional life during the Cold War. The biography must be grounded in historical accuracy but can include anything else you want. For example, if the person is a KGB officer, they might be in East Berlin during the Berlin Wall being built, but they also might be a traitor to their nation and spying for the US. This biography can be in the form of diary, journal, novel, movie, musical, etc. BE CREATIVE!!! Each student will be required to talk to me about your ideas before Spring Break. 400 points

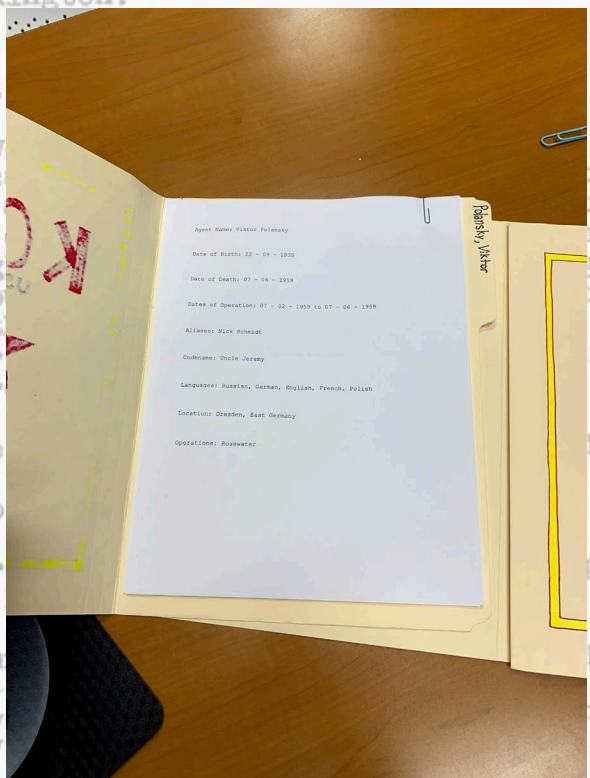
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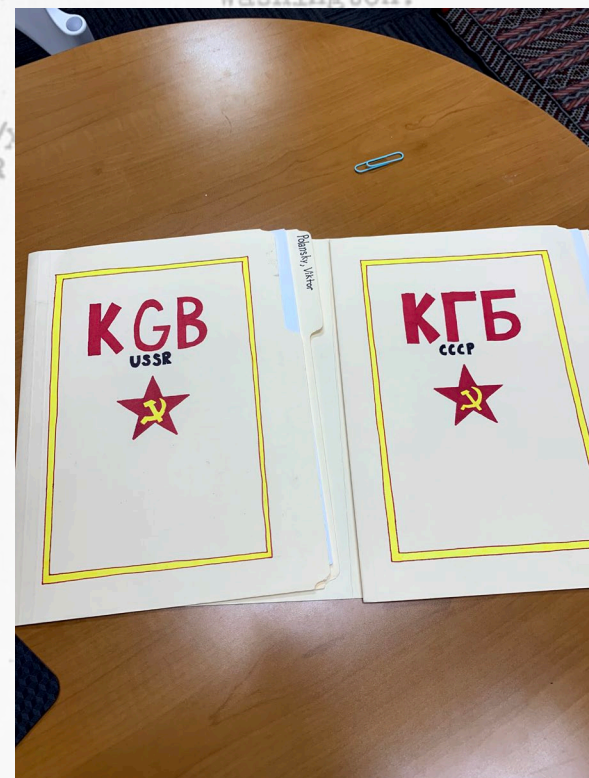
