**Meeting Called to Order:** Donna Caldwell established a quorum. The meeting was called to order at 3:04 pm by Donna Caldwell

Guest Speaker: Dr. Kelly Damphousse

Dr Damphousse: Updates regarding funding, enrollment, and COVID19

- State allocation funding formula is in place and the university lost money, A-State will not get back more than 95% of funding before the formula was put in place
- Graduation rate continues to climb and this impacts numbers of students enrolled
- Retention rate of current students is positive- Fall of 2017 (one of the highest rates) was at 79.6%; thus far this year it is at 77.9%
- This year's freshman class is smaller 1266 in the cohort, with a smaller cohort retention is even more important
- There are currently 2800 students in residence halls, move in this fall was staggered
- Fall 2020- 20% of courses being taught online, 20% hybrid and 60% face to face
- Currently 27 in isolation from residence halls, primarily being housed at Village Apartments
- Question: Is there a threshold that would push the University completely online? Answer: There is no single indicator- based on advice from NYIT, capacity of healthcare to meet number of cases, community spread and ability to continue the Return to Learn Plan
- Question: In Hybrid teaching how much flexibility do faculty have in percentage of online and F2F?

Answer: Defer to faculty member

### **Old Business:**

Faculty Association Secretary: Joanna Grymes reappointed FA Secretary by acclamation.

SGOC: SGOC cannot meet until all members are known. Several proposals have been received and during the first meeting a new chairperson will need to be elected.

### **New Business:**

Question was raised on issue of copyright of lecture materials and presentations in recorded Yuja and video lectures. Donna Caldwell will invite legal counsel to provide clarification.

Reapportionment: Reapportionment has been completed, there are now 39 senators which requires 21 for a Quorum. Per the Bylaws, all full time faculty in each college are counted. Academic Affairs receives information from Human Resources and there is a formula used to calculate numbers. Donna Caldwell will ask Human Resources to explain how numbers are calculated and what criteria are used. A committee will be formed to update the Constitution and Bylaws. Senators are asked to contact Donna Caldwell if they wish to serve on this committee.

### **Return to Learn:**

Paul Sikkel discussed effectiveness/ineffectiveness of face shields in reducing the spread of viral particles.
