- **FEAR OF THE UNKNOWN**
- **MISUNDERSTANDINGS ABOUT THE RESEARCH PROCESS**
- **LIMITED KNOWLEDGE OF THE ROLE OF RESEARCH IN WRITING**
- **PREVIOUS BAD EXPERIENCES WITH RESEARCH AND WRITING**

INSTRUCTIONAL OPTIONS: FIND WHAT WORKS FOR YOU AND HAVE FUN!

- **Create an imagined conversation between the dominant voices in your research**
- **Give the students a required setting such as a talk show, podcast, or dinner party**
- **Add public commenters**
- **Some instructors require direct quotations**
- **You can create specific prompts**
