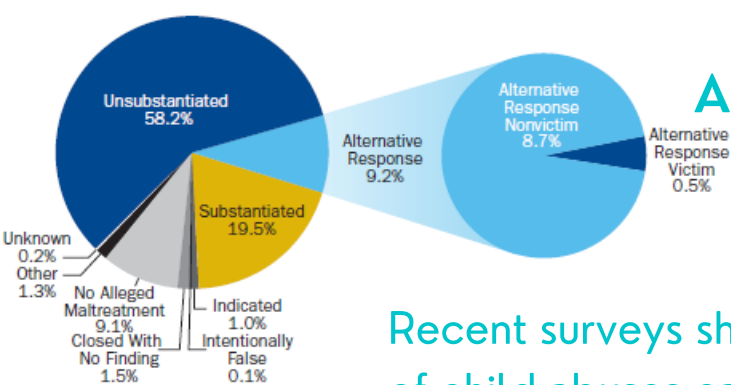

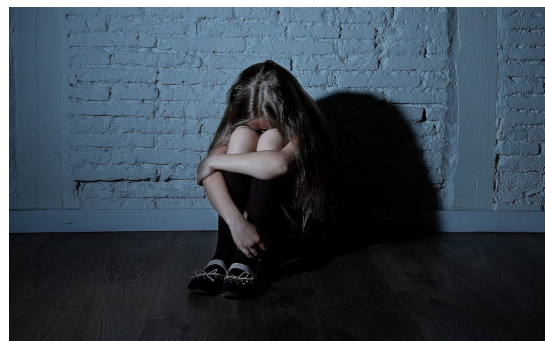
## Child Abuse/ Development of the Child

- Exhaustion: the child is constantly sleeping or tired
