

Dr. Ralph Young is Professor of History at Temple University in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He is the author of "Dissent in America: Voices That Shaped a Nation" and the founder of weekly campus-wide "teach-ins" at Temple. Dr. Young's writings have appeared in such publications as USA Today Magazine, the History News Network and he has been quoted countless times by news organizations including the Philadelphia Inquirer and WHYY/National Public Radio.

Dissent and protest have been at the heart of the American story from the first days of settlement to present day. "Dissent in America" traces the theme of dissent as it weaves its way through the fabric of American history. Dr. Young's collection of first-hand accounts show how dissenters fought to gain the rights they believed were denied to them, or others, or have disagreed with the government or majority opinion. Through songs, speeches, articles, testimonies, letters, and more, they tell the story of our nation and give us a unique look at the country that America has become.
