

APA 7th Ed: In-Text Citations Multiple Authors

APA style dictates that each resource referenced in a paper must have a citation, regardless if a resource is a direct quote, paraphrase, or summary. There are two kinds of citations:

• In-text: Resource's author is part of a sentence.

Example: Author's name (year)

• Parenthetical: No use of author's name in a sentence and citation is referenced in

parenthesis at the end of a sentence.

Example: (author, name, year)

Change from 6th to 7th edition: three or more authors, can use first author et al. with first reference.

Note: page number is used for direct quotations
