Shivan Haran, vice chair of the Senate, called the meeting to order at 3:01 p.m.

I. MINUTES:

Minutes from January 18, 2008 were presented for approval. They were approved with minor corrections for typos made and correction of one factual error (e.g., Richard Burns noted that he was present).

II. OLD BUSINESS

Professor Mooneyham made a motion that the Task Force A's proposal to bring the elimination of two committees in the Association bylaws to the full Association be brought up for a vote at the spring meeting.

Senator Stacy Alley seconded the motion. There was no discussion about the motion. Senator Wang called for the question. The motion passed unanimously.

III. NEW BUSINESS

Introduction of Shared Governance Items

Chairman Louella Moore said she had received no shared governance items.

Senator Bill Rowe mentioned that Eugene Smith, Professor Ferralasco and Professor Bert Greenwalt were three individuals named to the Centennial Committee. Moore clarified that this information was not a shared governance matter but, rather, an item of interest to the body.

Senator Mary Jackson-Pitts mentioned that the Handbook Committee would meet next week. Senator Burns inquired as to what items the committee would review and whether an agenda was available to peruse. Jackson-Pitts replied that she would ask investigate this matter.

Senator Rowe suggested that the Handbook Committee should consider appointing proxies to fill in for them to compensate for the problems scheduling conflicts proposed. Jackson-Pitts explained that it's difficult to appoint a proxy to serve on committees that are as complex as the Handbook Committee.

Faculty Senate Finance Report

Senator Rowe, chair of the Senate Finance Committee, yielded the floor to Louella Moore, to present the finance committee report.

Moore presented the report in PowerPoint format. Copies of the PowerPoint were also passed out to senators and others present.

Following the presentation, Senator Rowe suggested that we should circulate the report to the media and that senators should discuss it with people in their departments.

A motion was made to adopt the report. The motion was approved unanimously.

Senator Freer suggested that a press release on the report be drafted instead of the Senate relying on the press to report on the report.

Senator Burns inquired as to whether we would be ready to publicize the report's findings within two weeks.

Additional questions about the report and suggestions about how to move forward with the findings followed. Some senators even suggested that Chancellor Potts and Vice Chancellor Howard

should be made aware of the report as a matter of courtesy, given they inherited this negative situation (inflation of administration and inadequate faculty salary funding).

Senator Freer suggested that we should build our strategy by finding out who our allies are first. He suggested that students might very well be one of our allies, given that many of them are tired of the athletic fees.

Senator Rowe suggested that we propose that the university drop, eliminate or reduce athletic fees for summer session.

Chairman Moore asked senators to be thinking about an upcoming proposal that will move remedial math courses from the Math and Science Department to University College and get back to her with their thoughts.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:27 p.m.
