Meeting called to order at 3:00 pm

Presentations:

1) Dr. Marti Allen, Museum: Resources for Academic Use

The ASU Museum is a growth area of academic resources for faculty. Dr. Allen reported she had two main goals when coming the ASU. Goal 1 was to make the ASU museum more academic. Goal 2 was make the museum more responsive to its audiences. ASU was one of the first museums accredited in 1973 by AAM. ASU was last credited in 1996. The museum staff is currently on target to hand in materials December 2008 for accreditation. Just completed an inventory of the museum collections and are working to purchase archival materials for storage. They are looking to begin a two year museums credential program that could be house in one of several departments. The first student curated show will be about the Native Americans of Northeast Arkansas. To become more responsive to the audience the museum needs to become more aware of cultural needs (African American, Native American, Hispanic...) The museum is also working to improve exhibits for children and education. The Reynolds Foundation invited the ASU museum to submit a grant. Grant application is due Dec 12, 2008

2) Dean Bienke (EDUC): Informational report on Higher Education Holdings

Dean Bienke presented a prepared statement and document in response to concerns related to Higher Education Holdings. The concerns were raised by faculty members from the Educational Leadership department in a prepared document distributed at the last Faculty Senate meeting. He has come to set the record straight about the concerns set forth in the Oct. 3 document.

Dr. Fialla stated that with such opposing statements we need to find out what the facts are. He believed it is faculty senate's job to help determine what is accurate. Dr. Bienke believed that the issues should have gone through department and college channels rather than whole university.

3. Dr. Potts has worked on insurance. He stated he hoped to reinstate the \$400,000. He reported to have found a receptive audience at system office. System wants this to be a system action. Dr. Potts reported that things looked promising and should be finalized soon.

Old Business:

1) Minutes Presented for Corrections and/or Approval

2) Report from AGOC on item referred by Senate
McDaniel reported that they looked into changes in undergraduate admission requirements. It would appear from routing documents that no group beyond academic affairs signed off.

McDaniel spoke in support of the Shared Governance Proposal and urged approval. Rowe asked what will happen since Staff Senate has rejected the proposal. McDaniel state that Dr. Potts will have to decide. Moore directed senate to pg 15 of Section 1 of handbook and pointed out the problems related to the current shared governance requirements in the current handbook.
